

COVID SYMPTOMS

<u>Procedures at Hardwicke</u> <u>If a child displays:</u>

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature (37.8*C) they will feel hot on their head and back
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

We will contact parent/carer. Please come and collect your child and siblings as soon as you can.

Next Steps

- Whole household should isolate
- Book a test for the child with symptoms
- If Positive-the child needs to isolate for <u>10 days</u>
- If negative-please return all children to school assuming they are fit and well.
