Dear Parent/Carer,

Firstly, I would like to thank you all so very much for your kind words and messages. The team have worked tirelessly in order to prepare and deliver live teaching within 24 hours of the Prime Minister announcing the closure of schools for many children, except the for Critical Workers and Vulnerable. They have done a great job of managing the children remotely, as well as catering for those in school!

In order to ensure the expectations are clear for remote learning, we request that:

- Children should wear suitable clothing it might help the children to wear their school or PE jumper
- The same behavioural expectations will be in place for online learning as it would be for learning in the classroom
- Children should not record the lesson or take photos
- Parents are expected to be around during their child's online lessons; this does not necessarily need to be on the screen, but ideally in the same room.
- Language must be professional and appropriate, including any family members in the background.
- Videos may be muted for both pupils and staff if other children in the household become unsettled or cause a disruption
- · Parents monitor child's internet use and check that they are using technology safely
- Check online protection systems to ensure their time online is as safe as possible.
- Ensure that the children have a suitable amount of time away from the screen in the day

Your child's teacher will keep in touch through TEAMs and /or telephone to check how your child is getting on with their learning, as well as the elements that they are finding difficult. Where required, support will be offered to overcome misconceptions or in the case of the work not being sufficiently challenging, again responding to this so that future work planned helps them move forward.

Keeping children safe online when they are using technology remains a high priority for all of us. Please be assured that when we have suggested online platforms to support your child with home learning tasks, we have fully considered your child's safety.
