The EYFS team have been busy out and about on home visits. It has been so lovely to spend time meeting our new families and finding out about this year's lovely children. We look forward to forging partnerships with our parents over this important first year.

The children have been very excited to start school and it has been lovely to see them arriving in their crisp new uniforms and shiny shoes! Our transition sessions are well underway and we have been so impressed with the children's 'have a go' attitude to learning. We are beginning to establish some daily routines and the children are familiarising themselves with the learning areas both in the indoor and outdoor classrooms. We have some lovely friendships developing already.

Reading We have been 'getting to grips' with our phonics programme and the children have been 'superstars' and have already covered s, a, t and p. Our first reading books have gone home along with the homework pic 'n' mix menu. This half term we are learning these 'harder to read and spell words' (HRS words) **I, the, no, put, of, is, to, go, into, pull, as, his.**

Literacy This week we have been retelling the story of The Three Bears using body actions to help us visualise the story. We are now learning how to orally rehearse a sentence before we use our 'magic' writing and mark making to record.

Mathematics This week we are focusing on the text Six Dinner Sid and we have been learning to count and recognise numbers to six as well as ordering and demonstrating 1:1 correspondence up to six.

Team Year 6





Unsafe Parking – September 2022

The school has become aware from local residents that there are some issues with parking on Green Lane. Some cars are blocking the view from the exit of the plantation and causing blockages along the road. Some cars are also parking in the plantation, which is private property. Please can everyone make an effort to park safely; it would be terrible if a child was knocked over as a result of unsafe parking.

PLEASE REFRAIN FROM:

- Parking on double yellow lines
- Zig Zags
- In front of the school gates on the yellow zig zags
- On roundabouts or corners
- In driver turnaround spots
- Blocking driveways
