Welcome back! It has been a wonderful start to the new term and I am delighted to officially start as Headteacher here at Hardwicke. I would like to thank you all for your patience and feedback with regard to the drop off and collection. I'm sure you will agree that things have vastly improved since the first day! I would also like to thank you for wearing a mask when dropping off and collecting your child/ren — I appreciate your support with this. We will continue to adapt and improve the system until we all feel that it is working perfectly and I welcome your input into this. Therefore, from Monday 14th September, **Y1-Y6 teachers/TA's will be stood at the allocated gate as usual from 8:40. As soon as you see your child's teacher, please send your child to them. Reception teachers/TA's will be outside from 8:55-once you see them please send the children to their adult.** As soon as your child is with their teacher/TA, please leave the area in order to reduce the number of people in one space. Collection at the end of the day, will remain as it is at the moment. I understand that many of you have children at different gates-please do not worry about this. Staff will wait for the children at drop off and wait for parents/carers to collect at the end of the day.

As I'm sure you can imagine, school is an exciting place to be and the children have adapted so well to the new expectations. A special welcome to our new Reception children who have settled in extremely well! The priority is the safety and well-being of all children and staff and therefore, the children are establishing a new school routine that includes regular handwashing and where possible, social distancing. Children are remaining in their bubble (one per class) during learning time and break/lunchtimes.

The children look very smart in their school uniform. Uniform is very important as it gives each child a sense of belonging to our school community and I want the children to wear our school badge with pride. Please remember to send you child/ren in their PE kit on their allocated PE days. I would like to introduce a Hardwicke school PE kit and will begin to look into this. In the meantime, please ensure that the children wear a white t-shirt, black/blue jumper/hoodie, black/blue shorts or tracksuit bottoms and trainers. If possible, please avoid branded clothing. It is also important that children with hair that is shoulder length, tie their hair back at all times.

Plain hair bobbles only should be worn and all decorative hair accessories should be saved for the weekend. I really appreciate your support with this! I am delighted to share our new school website with you. You will find it at:

- 1 If you have a concern/worry about your child please share it with your child's class teacher via email to slt@hardwicke.gloucs.sch.uk. A member of the Senior Leadership Team(SLT) will then either respond or ask your child's class teacher to contact you directly via telephone.
- 2 If your concern/worry does not go away, then please raise this with the SLT via email - a member of the team will contact you directly either via telephone or email.

Please note that the SLT includes myself, Mrs Walpole and Mrs Gregory who are both acting deputy head for the Autumn Term 2020. All other communication about school should continue to be sent to :admin@hardwicke.gloucs.sch.uk.

Whilst I understand that sometimes we don't always get things right for you all and can occasionally cause frustration, I would appreciate you contacting the school directly, via the SLT email address, rather than using social media as a platform. I have outlined the clear lines for communication so please do use this - thank you!

COVID SYMPTOMS

Procedures at Hardwicke

If a child displays:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature (37.8°C) - they will feel hot on their head and back
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)



Then we will contact parent/carer. Please come and collect your child as soon as you can. You will be asked to take any siblings with you.

Next Steps

- Whole household should isolate
- Book a test for the child with symptoms
- If Positive-the child needs to isolate for **10 days** and the household for **14 days**
- If negative-please return all children to school assuming they are fit and well.
