Re Helping to Keep your Children Safe On-Line

Firstly, we'd like to thank you for the fantastic support you have been giving to your children as we all get used to the new norm that is Remote Learning. Naturally, as a result of this increased exposure to the on-line world, it is even more important that we do all we can to ensure that our children use the internet safely, and to minimise the chances of accidental exposure to material which might be disturbing, or inappropriate in any way.

We know that this is a concern to many parents. As a result of different families accessing the internet via different devices and through different providers, we have produced this guide which we hope will help you find the answers to questions such as:

- How to discuss on-line safety with your child
- How to set up parental controls on a device
- How to set up Safe Search on Google
- How to activate parental controls on your broadband.

Discussing On-Line Safety with your children

It is universally recognised that the first step towards keeping children safe on-line is to have an open and honest conversation with them about the dangers, as well as the benefits of the internet, and what to do if they accidentally encounter something they aren't sure about. There are many sites and resources which offer videos and activities on this theme for all age groups, as well as advice for parents on where to start. One such excellent site is **The UK Safer Internet Centre**

Setting up parental controls on a device

Whether your child is using an iPad or a laptop, Smartphone, or Play Station, it pays to take a few minutes to adjust the filters on what they may be able to access, if only accidentally. This can be easily done in a few clicks. The links below give simple instructions for the vast majority of devices. If your device isn't mentioned, let us know and we'll do our best to add it to the list.

How to set up Safe Browsing in Google

If you use Google to search the web, Safe search can be accessed by going to: https://www.google.com/preferences Simply select the Safe search option! (Be aware, however, that if your child uses other browsers, then similar adjustments would need to be made on those as well.)

Internet Service Provider Parental Controls

Perhaps the most comprehensive way to ensure that the internet environment that your child is using at home is safe, however, is via the Content Filters provided by your home Internet Service Provider.

Content filters are a tool typically included in parental control software. Filters aim to reduce the chances of children coming across inappropriate content while surfing the web.

All major broadband providers, including: **Virgin, Sky, BT and TalkTalk**, offer content filters as standard. See the links below for instructions from each provider as to how to set yours to suit your child's needs.
