Gloucester School Partnerships (GSP) are hosting 'The Really Wild Reading Festival' where children will get to meet famous authors and develop their love of reading!

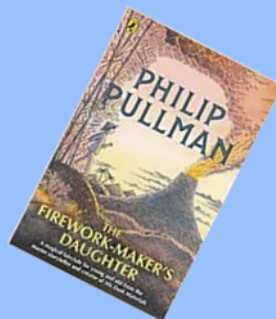
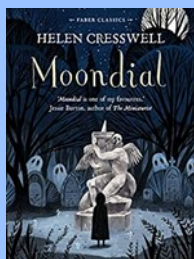

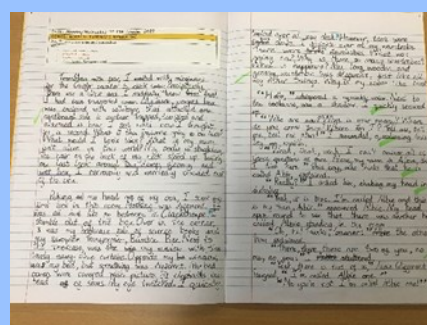
# English at Hardwicke

At Hardwicke we believe that **READING** is the key to the curriculum: the light that will enable our children to access all learning and 'Shine'.

From emergent readers engaging with the **ELS Phonics programme** through to children leaving us in Y6, we wish to foster a **love of reading** by immersing them in a rich variety of quality texts. "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go." – Dr Seuss.



Children leaving Hardwicke should do so with the skills and knowledge they need to be fluent, engaged and confident **WRITERS**. In line with our **reading** curriculum, we will teach a wide range of writing genres, thus enabling the children to write for a range of purposes. Through our "Do It, Stretch It, Use and Apply It" structured writing journeys, we will provide the building blocks needed to allow children to flourish as independent and creative writers.



# Maths at Hardwicke

At Hardwicke we follow the Mastery of Maths approach and use the Can Do Scheme to support our teaching. A mathematical concept or skill has been mastered when a child can represent it in multiple ways; has the mathematical language to communicate related ideas; and can demonstrate deep understanding through rich and complex problem-solving.

Our Maths teaching focuses on two daily taught sessions; Mastery Maths and Maths On Track (MOT).

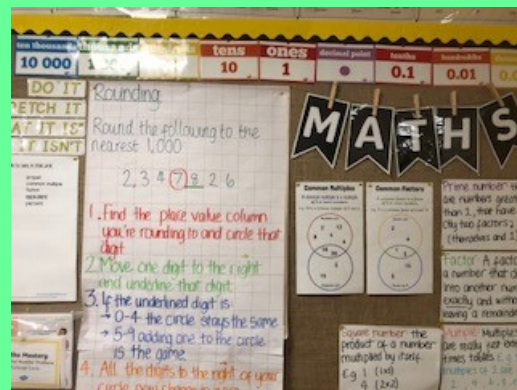
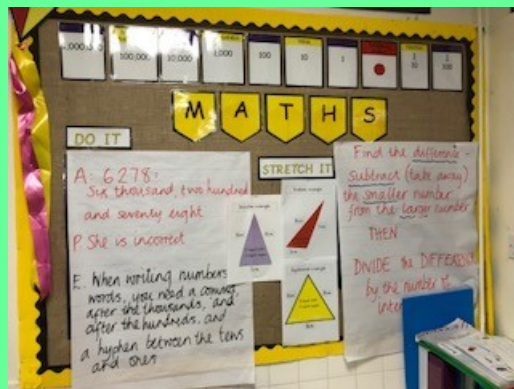
The Mastery Maths lesson lasts for 45 minutes and follows the pattern:

**Teach it—Do it — Stretch it—Solve it.**

The 'Teach it' is the teachers input of the days new key learning point. All children are included during the 'Teach it' and there is plenty of opportunity for partner talk and the use of probing questions.

The children then move to a short 'Do it' task that allows them to demonstrate their understanding of the key learning point. The 'Stretch it' task will further develop the children's understanding by looking at 'What it's Not' and applying their knowledge to reason.

Finally, there is a 'Solve it' task where the children will apply their understanding to investigate an open-ended challenge related to the key learning point.
